# Surpríses

I'm generally not a huge fan of surprises, especially when I know that "something" is coming, but I don't know what it is. Not knowing the specifics of what something will be like or how I will feel, that's what brings me anxiety about surprises and the unknown. When I was a child and my brother had chicken pox, I felt worse while I was waiting to get them than when I actually broke out in the rash. "Hey, Mom! I've got a surprise for you!" could mean anything from "I dug a "swimming pool" with a hand trowel in the backyard" or "I built a blanket fort encompassing the living room" to "I can hop on one leg." But the surprise birthday



party thrown by this congregation on September 22, took me completely by surprise! I had absolutely no idea that anything was coming... so I didn't fret over what it might be! Thank you all!!!

Even when we hope and pray for things – a baby, a new job, an actual diagnosis for assorted ailments – we are expecting "something," but we never truly know what to expect. I believe it was a Huggies commercial that said "Having a baby changes everything!" And it does. Despite all attempts to prepare for the changes, some things, *many* things are surprises when you welcome a baby into your family.

This applies to church growth and new members too. God gathers us into community as the church, as Edgewood Presbyterian Church. And while God's love, mercy, and grace are steadfast and sure, God surprises us. In the Presbyterian church, at least in seminary, we talk about the church as "reformed and always to be reformed according to the Word of God' in the power of the Spirit" (*PC(USA) Book of Order*, F-2.02). Change, particularly the unexpected and surprising kind, is an inevitable and necessary part of growth and development. Have you heard the saying "you can never step into the same river twice?" As the water flows, the river changes in various degrees, making it impossible to step in to the exact same place again.

So too with life and the church. We may hold on to traditions, but we will never be the same church as we once were. The world has changed, people have come and gone, the leaves fall from the trees. But as the trees remind us, the leaves must drop away so that new leaves, new growth, new flourishing, can grow come spring. As we plan, pray, and hope for church growth over the next few years, we *will* be surprised. We will be surprised by God's working in and among us to be "a church to call home" for new family members.



#### **Our New Music Director**

## **Property & Grounds**


A new light was installed outside, over the Fellowship Hall door for improved visibility on the walkway toward the parking lot.


